

Did you know that there are more than 65 people who regularly volunteer at the district level? And that's not counting all the people who volunteer as moderators or pulpit fill for a congregation that is not their own, as mentors to discerners, for particular one-time projects, or just when something is needed... It's an incredible endeavor we do together!

This is the best of what it means to be a member of the Body of Christ – every single person has a role to play in the body, a role suited to the uniqueness God has created in them. In the Church of the Brethren, each of us is called to ministry at our baptism, called to steward our gifts for the good of the kingdom, for the glory of God, and for our neighbor's good.

Also in the Church of the Brethren, we expect that calling is always a combination of internal call and external call affirming one another. The call may come externally first, perhaps from someone asking you to serve in a particular capacity or naming gifts you have. Or the call may come internally first, perhaps from an internal sense of God's nudging to be more involved in a particular area of gift. Often when the call comes, we are startled by it. Like Moses, we often feel some version of, "Who, me? Are you sure you don't want someone else?" But when an internal calling is affirmed by an external calling ("you'd be really good at that!") or when an external calling is affirmed by an internal calling ("I feel a surprising sense of peace or excitement about that possibility!"), we in the Church of the Brethren, trust it, no matter how surprising or disruptive it might be.

I'm not a fan of asking people to fill holes in the church. Often we come at volunteering like an obligation. "Someone's gotta do it... I guess it may as well be me..." That's noble, certainly, but it may not be an expression of God's call. Instead, I try to seek volunteers through prayer and discernment, looking for the person God is nudging to serve the church and the world in a particular way. It's more an art than a science, more an intuitive than a practical stance.

I always say that a well-discerned "no" is as important as, and sometimes more difficult than, a well-discerned "yes." There are so many good things in the world to say yes to. But are we saying yes in the ways and places that God is calling us to say yes? And are we saying no to roles God is not calling us to, in order to make room for saying yes when the call is clear? Are we willing to be surprised and follow anyway, when God nudges in a direction we were not

expecting?

You may have guessed... it is nominating season. We are working at calling a number of people to various roles in the district. And we are looking, not just for warm bodies to fill holes, but for the people God is calling to participate in leadership. You may know that before we do! If God is nudging you, let us know. You also may know people around you who you sense God might be calling into service of the Body. If God reveals someone to you, let us know. And if we call you, that means that God has put your name in our hearts. Pray with it and see if the internal affirmation of that call comes. Don't be afraid to say no when we call if you don't sense God's voice in the invitation. But also – don't be afraid to say yes, even if you think, "who, me?" You might be just exactly the person the church needs in this moment.

(PS, Serving on committees doesn't always sound like fun, but laughter and fellowship is a sustaining part of our work at the district. You might have more fun than you anticipate! You certainly will be surrounded by mature and growing Jesus followers doing good work in the world!)
